- Demonstrable financial stability and adequate capitalization
- Comprehensive compliance programs covering AML/CFT, player protection, and data security
- Qualified personnel with proven track records in regulated gaming
- Robust internal controls and governance frameworks
- Technology systems that meet security and audit requirements

The application process isn't just about documentation—it's about demonstrating your organization's commitment to operating with integrity in the UAE market.
